How good is life for the pure in heart, because they will see God. How good is life for the peacemakers, because they will be called children of God. How good is life for those who have been persecuted on account of doing what is right, because theirs is the kingdom of the skies.

Matthew 3.8-10 (BibleProject translation)

One thing to remember about scripture is that it is the story of Jesus. He tells us as much in Luke 24.27. It is quite natural to read to find help or inspiration for our day. I do it all the time, and God often speaks to us as we do. But it's worth remembering once in a while it's really about Jesus. So as we head into Holy Week why not reflect on the Beatitudes in that light. He is the one of which the beatitudes most eloquently speaks. He was born into a poor family and never rose through the ranks of learned hierarchy or respected society. He mourned with those who mourn and spent his life in hungering for the putting right of this world, and demonstrated more than any what it is to respond to others with mercy; with over-abundant love. And he was fully devoted to the mission he had been given by God. That's the pure in heart bit. We're not meant to think of a 'holier than thou' kind of purity. Rather, we are to think of refined gold: the true stuff, through and through; the internal is consistent with the external; the words go right through the stick of rock; it does what it says on the tin. This will be the foundation for the rest of the sermon. My mind goes to that wonderful verse in John 13.1: *'Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.'* He loved us with pure consistency through and through, longing for us to be included in God's great 'shalom'. But peacemakers in this world are not as popular as we might think. They encourage us to shake hands with our enemies,

and take from us the precious vendettas and boundary markers that, in some instances, define our very existence. And so persecution ensues. And for Jesus, that was to the very death, even death on a cross. Yet, this Holy Week, we remember he swallowed the pain of peacemaking that we might be free. We join with him in his journey that he might share our pain, and our suffering and disappointment. So that as he carried the cross he might carry us toward a life that could truly be described as 'good': the Good Life. And so one response to the Beatitudes is to say to Jesus, "Thank You".




will also shortly provide an electronic link so you can sign up on-line. Please contact the Church Office if you have any queries.
