A message from Ruth

For Jesus' friends and family, watching him die a cruel and unjust death, must have been an unimaginable loss, a personal grief further compounded by the death of a dream. Jesus, not just the one they loved, but he who had promised so much, who had changed so many lives, who they believed would change their future.

In the mess of my every day, I too readily feel the hopelessness of those grouped at the foot of the cross. As I grapple with the challenges of life, I too easily see only the apparent defeat of Good Friday.

Reading the Easter narrative again this year I was however struck by Jesus' early morning encounter with Mary. Jesus did not run through the salvation narrative, nor did he remind her of everything that he had said about his death and resurrection. He did not diminish her pain, or scold her for her lack of faith - in the quietness of the dawn garden, he simply called her by her name.

It was a moment of intimacy, when all the questions suddenly didn't matter - there would be time for working it all out another day. For Mary, to hear her name from the lips of the one she loved and believed in, was enough. That moment, that single word, changed everything.

And so, as the calendar rolls on, I am determined to make time for those 'quiet moments in the garden', away from my questions, my need to get my theology straight and my sense of being overwhelmed by the world around me.

I recognise that I too will find peace and hope in the stillness, and that like Mary, Jesus knows and calls me by my name.

and to rise again for our justification:
grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness
that we may always serve you
in pureness of living and truth;
through the merits of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord,

one God, now and for ever.


